

I'VE GOT A DECEMBER ROUND OFFER – WHAT DO I DO NOW?

What you're thinking

I'm happy with the December round offer and don't want to be considered for other courses in the January round.

I have a first preference offer but I think I'd like to try for other courses in the January round.

I have a second to sixth preference offer and want to be considered for a higher preference in the January round.

I've changed my mind and don't want my December offer at all now. I want to change my preferences and be considered in the January round.

What you need to do

Accept or defer your place according to the instructions in your offer email.

Don't accept / defer / reject your offer. Move the offered first preference code to a lower position. Add other courses as higher preferences by 8 January.

Don't accept / defer / reject your offer. EITHER leave your preferences as they are, OR move the offered preference code to a lower position, and add other courses as higher preferences by 8 January.

Don't accept / defer / reject your offer. Remove the offered preference code. Add new preferences by 8 January.

What will happen in the January round

You'll have secured your place and won't be considered for any further preferences in the January round.

You'll get offered one of your higher preferences if you're eligible, and (for quota courses) if you're ranked highly enough. If not, you'll get your December offer again.

You'll get offered one of your new preferences if you're eligible, and if there are places available.
