

## RELEASE OF SCALED SCORES AND ATARS FOR 2025 WACE EXAMINATION CANDIDATES

The Tertiary Institutions Service Centre (TISC) is responsible for releasing your WACE course scaled scores to you. If you are a school leaver sitting four or more examinations or a mature age student sitting two or more examinations, TISC also calculates your ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admission Rank).

### Online Release

TISC expects to release your results on Friday, 19 December 2025 via [www.tisc.edu.au](http://www.tisc.edu.au).

You will need your:

- User ID: Your 8-digit WACE candidate number.
- Password: If this is your first time on TISC's website, use your default password (instructions on Login/Register screen), then set your own password for future logins.

If you've logged in before, use the password you set previously.

*TISC recommends that you check your TISC login is working BEFORE results are released, even if you are not planning to apply for university through TISC. This minimises any delay in accessing your results, as TISC staff will be dealing with a high volume of email/phone queries when results are released.*

You will be able to access your results online (as detailed below) until 28 February 2026. After this date, your results will only be available as hard copy for which a fee is payable.

Your Universities Admission Advice Letter (UAAL) shows:

- Course Scaled Score(s)
- Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR), if achieved
- University admission requirement messages.

### Hard Copy

You can:

- print a pdf of your UAAL when you access your results online (until 28 February 2026); and/or
- order a copy of your UAAL on TISC stationery. Cost: \$30 for first copy per order and \$18 for additional copies ordered at the same time. These copies can be ordered as part of the TISC application process or separately. For further details, see [www.tisc.edu.au](http://www.tisc.edu.au). Note that hard copy is available at the above fee until 28 February 2026. After that date, the cost will increase.

### Release to Schools

TISC reports students' scaled scores and ATARs to students' schools to enable schools to monitor student assessment and provide counselling. This is done in accordance with TISC's Privacy Policy, and on the understanding that a school will not release any student's results to a third party without authorisation from the student concerned (see [www.tisc.edu.au](http://www.tisc.edu.au) for TISC's Privacy Policy).
